

Club of the Year

A Program of the Office of Student Life

“Club of the Year” is a program that has been created to enhance campus activities and improve student involvement on campus. Points are awarded to clubs each semester according to the guidelines below. The point system is designed to reward clubs who are active *on campus* and to encourage clubs to host events and activities and to create projects for the benefit of FLC students and the campus community. The “Club of the Year” award will be presented to the winning club’s President at the annual Student Recognition banquet at the end of the Spring Semester.

Club points are awarded June 25, 2008- May 1, 2009. Events are only eligible for points if correct procedures are followed as outlined in the Student Club Handbook.

Points will be monitored and recorded by The Office of Student Life, in order to ensure that all of your points are recorded, please keep track of your events and complete the “club of the year” form in the event-planning packet at least once a month. Events/activities that are not documented are not eligible for points.

Campus Enrichment: 5 points each

Sponsoring an event on campus (events must include; creating a project that targets FLC students and is designed to enhance student life.

College Hour: 4 points each

Sponsoring a college hour (Tuesdays/Wednesdays, 12-1pm).

Student Life Participation: 3 points each

Participating in approved campus events hosted by other campus Clubs or Student Government. Contributing to a project designed by Campus Clubs or Student Government.

Campus Participation: 2 points each

Participating in a campus event hosted by Administration, Student Services or another campus entity.

Club Meetings: 8 points per semester

Holding regular meetings (at least one per month) throughout the semester. Copy of minutes from meetings must be submitted to The Office of Student Life.

ICC meetings: 2 points per meeting

Attendance at Inter-Club Council meetings

Workshops: 3 points per workshop

Club Members attend approved leadership development workshops; Club members attend workshops designed for clubs; Club hosts an approved workshop on campus.

Student Senate Meetings: 1 point per meeting

Club presents a “club update” at a Student Government Senate meeting. Senate meetings are held the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month at 2:00pm in FL1-104.

***Other ways to earn points:*

-The Office of Student Life may offer opportunities to earn points throughout each semester. Club Presidents will be notified of these opportunities at least two weeks in advance.

-Co-Sponsoring an event with another club will double the points earned for that event for each club.
