- **Book with a corporate author** (the author is an organization)

- **Book with no author named**  
McGraw-Hill Dictionary of Scientific and Technical Terms. New York: McGraw, 2003.
- **Book with an editor (with no author named)**  
Espejo, Roman, ed. Biomedical Ethics: Opposing Viewpoints. San Diego, CA: Greenhaven, 2002.

## PRINT RESOURCES – ARTICLES & ESSAYS

- **Article or essay in an anthology or collection**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article or Essay." Title of Source. Editor(s). Place of Publication: Publisher, Year: Pagination.

Hale, Amy. "Whose Celtic Cornwall?: The Ethnic Cornish Meet Celtic Spirituality." Celtic Geographies: Old Culture, New Times. Ed. David C. Harvey. London: Routledge, 2002: 157-170.

- **Article in a magazine**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Periodical Abbreviated Month (except May, June, or July) Year: Pagination. *If the magazine is published more frequently than once a month, give the complete date (see second example below). If the article continues on other pages, but not on consecutive pages, write only first page of article, followed by a plus sign (see third example below).*

Kenney, Brian. "The Virtual Gets Real: A Day in the Life of a Virtual Library." Library Journal 15 Sept. 2003: 32-35.

Gold, Dinah. "Managing Mornings." Health Dec. 2003: 93+.

- **Article in a newspaper**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Periodical Day Month Year, Edition: Section/Page(s). *If the article continues on other pages, but not on the next consecutive page, note only first section/page of article, followed by a plus sign (see example below).*

Kollars, Deb. "Total Overhaul Sought in Funding for Schools." The Sacramento Bee 11 December 2003, final ed.: A1+.

- **Article in a scholarly journal**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Journal Volume Number (Year): Pagination.

Wilkin, Phil. "European Integration, 1945-2003: From the European Economic Community to the European Union." Choice: Current Reviews for Academic Libraries 40 (2003): 1851-1866.

## ELECTRONIC RESOURCES

- **An Electronic Book**

Author's Last Name, First Name. Title of Book. Place of Publication: Publisher, Date of Publication. Name of Library or Library System subscribing to the database, its City and State. Day Month Year of Access <URL>.

- **Article in an on-line database (library subscription service)**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of the Printed Source Day Month Year: Pagination (*if starting page only given, note starting page, followed by a hyphen, a space, and a period*). Title of the Database. Name of the Service or Vendor (if available). Name of Library or Library System subscribing to the database, its City and State. Day Month Year of Access.

- **Article in an Online Journal**

Author's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." Name of the Journal. Volume Number, Issue Number, or Other Identifying Numbers (Date of Publication). Pagination or Total Number of Pages, Paragraphs, or Other Sections, if they are Numbered. Day Month Year of Access <URL>.

- **An Entire Web site**

Title of the Site. Name of Editor of the Site (if available). Date of Electronic Publication or of the Latest Update (if available). Name of the Sponsoring Institution or Organization. Day Month Year of Access <URL>.

- **Article on a Web site**

Author's Last Name, First Name (if available). "Title of Article." Name of Web Site. Date of Electronic Publication or of the Latest Update (if available). Name of institution or organization sponsoring the site. Day Month Year of Access <URL>.

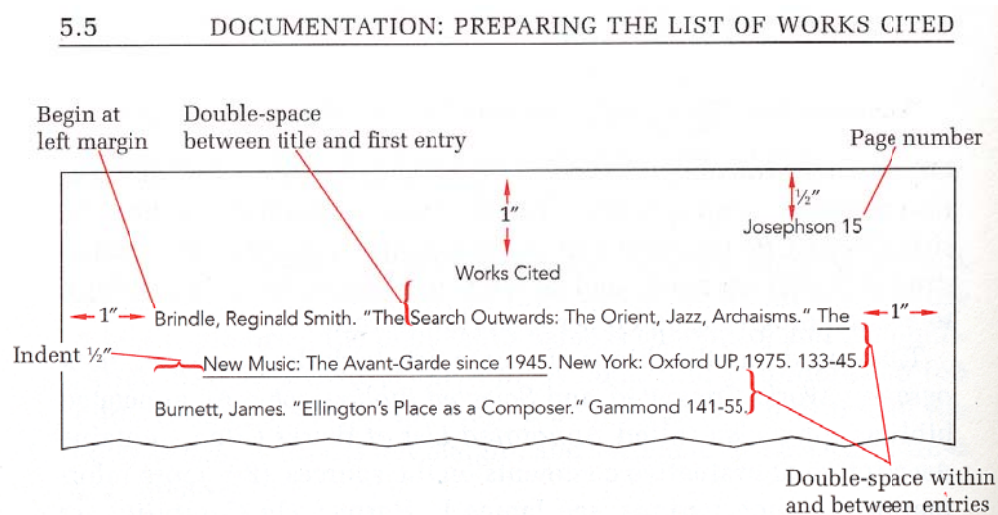


Fig. 14. The top of the first page of a works-cited list.
