TESTS OFFERED

English - CTEP

The English test measures reading and writing skills. It is composed of three sections: reading comprehension, sentence structure & grammar, and sentence & syntax skills. It is administered on the computer and is timed. Allow 1.5 hours.

ESL – CELSA

The English as a Second Language (ESL) test is for students whose native language is not English and who wish to enroll in ESL classes. The test is administered on the computer and is timed. Allow 1.0 hour.

Math - MDTP

There are 4 levels of assessment. Choose based on your comfort level. Please see sample tests to help you select the right level. The tests are administered on the computer and are timed. Allow 1 hour for the first 3 levels and 2 hours for the pre-calculus test.

- 2) Elementary Algebra
 - a. Math 100
 - b. Math 112

- 3) Intermediate Algebra

- 4) Pre-Calculus
 - a. Math 335
 - b. Math 370
 - c. Math 400

Graduation Competency for AA/AS Degree

The reading and math graduation competencies may be satisfied by completing specific courses or by passing the competency examination through the Assessment Center. Consult with your counselor to determine whether you need an examination.

Reading - CTEP

The test is composed of reading passages followed by questions regarding the content. It is administered on the computer and is timed. Allow 45 minutes. Only two attempts are permitted.

Math - DTMS

You must call to make an appointment to take this test. The test is composed of elementary algebra items. No calculators are permitted. It is a paper-pencil test and is 30 minutes in length. A maximum of 4 attempts within a two-year period (2 times per semester, once in summer) is allowed.

Ability-to-Benefit (ATB)- CPAt / CELSA

You must call to make an appointment to take this test unless you are an ESL student taking the CELSA. The ATB test is administered to students who do not have a high school diploma (or its equivalent) and are applying for financial aid. Eligible students must be at least 18 years old and must not be currently enrolled in high school. The CPAt test is paper/pencil and is one hour in length.
